What is a Certificate of Authenticity?

The Certificate of authenticity is an official document that proves that the work of art you bought from the artist Trebor is genuine and authentic. It is one of the helpful tools in proving the work's provenance, quality, and it ensures you, the buyer, that it was created and produced by myself, the artist and no one else.

Why Do You Need a Certificate of Authenticity?

In the fast-paced online art world that most buyers and artists are currently immersed in, selling or reselling a work of art often occurs in the blink of an eye. The art-of-the-sale is an exciting, exhilarating process for all concerned, but it is extremely important that all the proper documentation be available to ensure the legality of the transaction... especially for the buyer. Trebor is aware of this requirement and with every online purchase of an original painting, a certificate of authenticity or COA is included in the shipping carton or can be sent by registered mail.

What a Trebor "Certificate of Authenticity" contains?

1. Picture of the artwork
2. Title of the work
3. Year and month of completion
4. Dimensions
5. Medium used
6. Edition number, if applicable
7. Special instructions, if applicable
8. Statement of Authenticity
9. Artist copyright statement
10. Artist name and signature

What other information is sent to you?

The backside of every painting is signed by the artist. Also, Trebor sign's his painting on the side or edges since the space is sufficient for this. He feels that signing the front of the painting distracts the viewer from the subject matter and the message in the painting.

Included on the backside are the dimension of the painting, date that it was completed and the necessary contact information if you wish to get in touch with the artist. Also, a paper copy of the bill of sale/invoice is sent to you.
